Saints Alive! Fr. Ray's favorite Saints this week...

February 3: St. Blaise (316+). We will bless throats at both of the Masses this glorious Monday.

Feb 4: St. Rabanus Maurus (784-856) was born in Mainz, educated in Fulda and learned Greek, Hebrew and Syriac to be able to comment on the scriptures in Charlemagne's court library. Oh, and when we sing, veni creator spiritus? Yep, that one was penned by St. Rabanus himself.

Feb 5: St. Agatha (251+) is known in Christian art and iconography for having her breasts cut off; she was born in Catania Sicily. She is painted as offering her breasts on a tray. Pope Damasus wrote a hymn in her honor in 370. She is one of the most beloved and invoked saints

Feb 6: St. Paul Miki and companions (1597+). The first martyrs of Nagasaki were 26 crucified Catholics (17 of whom were native Japanese); they were raised on crosses and pierced with lances for not denouncing their faith.

Feb 7: St. Richard, "pilgrim king" (720). I prayed at his tomb at San Frediano's church in Lucca. He and his two sons travelled from England to Rome on pilgrimage; the father died here. Then the extraordinary miracles that happened at this tomb defied description.

Feb 8: St. Jerome Emiliani (1481-1537) imprisoned in chains, he prayed for delivery and was set free; he made good his vow and opened a new congregation to teach orphan boys in the north of Italy between Milan and Venice. The first to create "question and answer" catechisms. But wait! St. Josephine Bakhita (1868-1947). A new 'awareness day' is on the calendar – the

awareness of human trafficking - thanks to St. Josephine's gracious movement from slavery to religious life: from the Sudan to Italy. Her forgiveness of the Muslim slave traders is haunting.

Feb 9: St. Apollonia (249+) a "wonderful old lady" and deaconess of the church of Alexandria had every tooth pulled from her head...then she raced to the funeral pyre and her own death in ancient Alexandria, Egypt.

Through your generous giving of your time and resources, up to 25 homeless men and women had a warm, safe place to spend the night and a good dinner and breakfast in hospitable surroundings. Our workers filled over three-fourths of the monitoring jobs and two-thirds of the meal-related jobs when WARM was hosted at St. Andrew's Episcopal Church January 5-12. It is so important that St. John's be part of this ongoing ecumenical effort to provide shelter and meals to the homeless of our county during the coldest months. You are Christian witnesses who put your faith in practice and spread Christ's message that all are to be treated with love and concern.



Community Service Opportunity

The St. John's Charitable Society (SJCS) is a group of parish volunteers whose goal is to assist residents of St. Mary's County who are struggling to make ends meet.

The primary work of SJCS is carried out through a <u>phone ministry</u> whereby our volunteers accept calls from those in need, and determine if, and how, SJCS can help. Working in teams of two, our volunteers commit to taking calls over a two week period. Phone assignments occur approximately 4-5 times per year, and are planned around each volunteer's schedule requirements.

All calls are handled on a dedicated SJCS cell phone and all client information is kept confidential. A meeting of SJCS members takes place every other Thursday evening to review and discuss client calls. Otherwise, the phone ministry is carried out within the <u>volunteer's home environment</u>. Training is provided for new volunteers.

In addition to the phone ministry, SJCS volunteers also engage in:

Organizing the Christmas Angel Tree Program, to help make Christmas happier for a child or elderly person in need.

Coordinating St. John's parish participation in Wrapping Arms 'Round Many (WARM). The St. John's volunteers participate as a "helping church" in the local interfaith effort to provide meals and overnight shelter for overflow homeless of St. Mary's County during the winter.

Through participation in SJCS, our volunteers: Improve lives; Provide second chances; Meet others who desire to put Christian values into action by serving the local community.
