**August 29th: Beheading of St.**

**John the Baptist** (30+) has been the feast (since the 5<sup>th</sup> century) that has captured the imagination of painters and playwrights of every generation because it pits the prophetically righteous up against the lasciviously debauched.

**August 30: St. Narcisa** (1832-1869) worked as a seamstress to contribute to her family. Supported by the guidance of several spiritual directors, she resolved to consecrate herself to Christ. Narcisa was frequently seen in a state of ecstasy. She spent the concluding months of her life in Lima, Peru, where she died on December 8, 1869 at the age of thirty-seven.

**St. Pammachius** (410) was a friend of St. Jerome who married St. Paula's daughter Paulina, and whose house I hope to visit in Rome – on the Coelian Hill. He founded a pilgrim's hospice in Porto. I like married saints who could hold his own in theological

discussions with celibate saints like Jerome, Ambrose, Siricius, Paulinus, and Augustine.

**August 31st: ST. RAYMOND**

**NONNATUS** (1204-1240) My Dad (ray Sr.) was named for this obscure saint for obvious reasons: St. Raymond was the patron saint of difficult delivery and birth and grandma was struggling to give birth to this healthy baby boy. St. Raymond's shrine is in Portello in Catalonia. He died at the age of 36 after abusive treatment as a prisoner in Algiers.

**September 1st: St. Gilles** (650-710) was a Greek hermit who became one of the most popular saint in the Middle Ages; he founded an abbey in Provence. His relics were restored to the abbey in the 1860's. St. Gilles is the patron saint of the physically disabled. We pray at Sant'Egidio (Gilles in Italian) Church in Trastevere when in Rome.

**September 2: St. Agricol d'Avignon**

(630-700) was a great bishop "in charge" of good weather. I dated a gal back in '78 whose father grew flowers on the banks of the Rhône, and when storms arrived, we approached the relic skull of St. Agricol in prayer. But wait, what about **Bd. Jacques -Louis Schmid** (1752-1792). He was one of 71 priests butchered on this day during the French Revolution at St-Firmin. I like his last name!

**September 3: St. Gregory the Great** (540-604). Pray that we get other popes like this guy. I pray at his tomb at the Vatican and at his family mansion on the Coelian Hill when in Rome. Nobody writes like him – I like his style better than that of Augustine. His letters are so warm and intelligible.

**September 4: St. Rosalia of Sicily** (1166) is the principal patron saint of Palermo who, as a solitary cave dwelling hermit, has a knack for showing up and healing the distraught.

The RCIA program explains the major dogmas of the faith including: the importance of faith and authority, the divinity of Christ, the Trinity, making a good confession, the real presence of the Eucharist, proper understanding of the 10 Commandments.

## Sacraments

### BAPTISMS

The Rite of Baptism is celebrated by appointment. Parents are required to meet with the pastor and attend an obligatory preparation session preferably before the birth of your child. Call the rectory to schedule your appointment.

### MARRIAGES

Arrangements must be made at least 6 months in advance of the ceremony.

### SACRAMENT OF THE SICK

Please notify the rectory when a parishioner would like to receive the sacraments and is homebound, in a nursing home, or in the hospital.

### R.C.I.A

(Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults): Those who are interested in becoming Catholic or completing their sacraments are invited to contact the rectory at any time.





## Status of St. John's/SCN Mission Activities

### Mission #15:

The "St. John's Mary Mileto House" has been postponed multiple times due to the COVID-19 pandemic and is currently scheduled for 6-12 March 2022. Due to the postponements and the rising cost of materials, an additional \$1,300 was sent for the increased costs.



### Mission #16:

Amazingly, St. John's is venturing on the groundwork plans for their 16<sup>th</sup> mission! So much has been accomplished by St. John's in the last 7 years in so many mission areas throughout the world, and in our own country – Belize City, Belize; Botswana, Africa; Las Flores, Belize; Crow Reservation, Pryor, Montana; Dunbar, Pennsylvania; and Durant, Mississippi. Efforts included building houses, repairing homes, working in desolate school mission areas, painting schools, laying block, pouring concrete, and assisting with disaster relief. You have helped change many people's lives. A request for volunteers will be sought at a later date via the bulletin. It has not been determined whether the next mission will be inside or outside the Continental United States.

Our annual mission collection will be held the weekend of 25-26 September 2021. The current cost to build a 16' x 20' two-room house in Belize has increased to \$8,200, which includes plumbing, aluminum shutters, and electric. Whatever the mission, our focus is on meeting people, learning about other cultures, making friends and sharing faith, while we work side-by-side with people in need. We know it has been a difficult year, but any help you can give would be so appreciated. Make your check payable to St. John's Church and in the memo line write: "Belize Missions".
