SS. Cosmas & Damian

September 26: SS Cosmas and Damian (287+) are the twin brothers and physician martyrs who died just north of Antioch in Syria. The rite of incubation for healing dreams started with them in Constantinople.

St. Thérèse Couderc (1805-1885) is the founder of the “Daughters of St. Regis;” she dedicated her life to giving retreats to the women who arrived in pilgrimage at the shrine of St. John Francis Regis in LaLouvesc. Her incorrupt body is just up the street from the relics of our patron saint. Blessed and soon to be canonized

September 27: St. Vincent de Paul (1581-1660) spent two years as a slave in Tunisia, which gave him a tender concern for the poorest ones. He personally contributed to the complete

renewal of the clergy in 17th century France. Visit his relics just around the block from the Rue du Bac in Paris.

September 28: St. Lorenzo Ruiz (1637+) is the glorious Filipino martyr who left Manila for Japan – and who remained constant during arrest, the slow burning of his body and then the torture of the pit.

September 29: SS Archangels Michael, Gabriel, Raphael are the archangels sent to protect, communicate and heal all who call. Popular devotion to Michael grows by leaps and bounds in this time of crisis.

September 30: St. Jerome (345-420) takes the award as the most learned, difficult,

restless and combative of saints ever! He is best known for his scholarship in Bethlehem from age 40 to 75. I prayed at his cell in Bethlehem and at his relic’s shrine at Santa Maria Maggiore.

October 1: St. St. Thérèse de Lisieux (1873-1897). She revealed herself as my special protector. “I am perfectly sure that I shall not stay inactive in heaven; my desire is to go on working for the Church and for souls.”

October 2: Bd. Antoine Chevrier (1826-1879) St. John Vianney had at least one young diocesan priest buddy from Lyons! St. John Vianney had 35 years of priestly experience under his belt to inspire his young friend.

Are you interested in becoming Catholic? Would you like to receive any of the sacraments of initiation such as baptism, confirmation, or first communion? If so, the Holy Spirit is trying to speak with you right now! The RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults) program resumes on Sunday September 12th. Class will meet in the St. Jude Room between the end of the 9am mass and the beginning of the 1130am mass... so 10am-11:15am. Even if you have completed your sacraments of initiation, please be an evangelist by informing other people of this opportunity to learn more about the faith. The RCIA program explains the major dogmas of the faith including: the importance of faith and authority, the divinity of Christ, the Trinity, making a good confession, the real presence of the Eucharist, proper understanding of the 10 Commandments.

BAPTISMS

The Rite of Baptism is celebrated by appointment. Parents are required to meet with the pastor and attend an obligatory preparation session preferably before the birth of your child. Call the rectory to schedule your appointment.

MARRIAGES

Arrangements must be made at least 6 months in advance of the ceremony.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK

Please notify the rectory when a parishioner would like to receive the sacraments and is homebound, in a nursing home, or in the hospital.

(Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults): Those who are interested in becoming Catholic or completing their sacraments are invited to contact the rectory at any time.



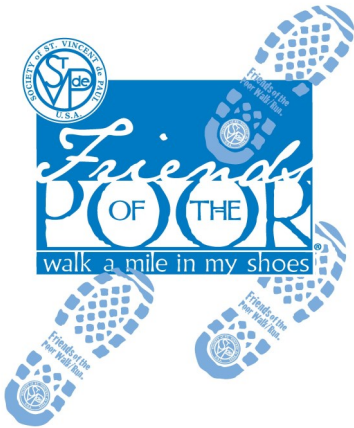
